THE new garden space at Port Melbourne Uniting Church was officially opened during a moving open air service on Palm Sunday.

The new garden space provides a welcoming



community space for meeting. resting, contemplation and prayer. Flowing around two existing Canary island palms, it features drought

tolerant plants and fruit trees, a curving rainbowcoloured wall, and seating in both shade and sunshine. The pathways incorporate pebble streams flowing towards the Bay and a simple labyrinth for contemplative prayer. Fruit trees planted around the garden complement the community vegetable garden which was developed in 2008.

Moderator, Isabel Thomas-Dobson, dedicated the garden with these spirit-stirring words:

Jesus Christ who sought out quiet places for prayer, and the Holy Spirit by whose creativity we are renewed and inspired,

Assessments will include a collaborative learning project on selected themes plus two individual short papers arising from the Basis of Union.

Slow down sought for safer streets

IN response to resident concerns about safety on our local rural roads, the Peninsula SaferSpeeds project will be reducing speeds on select rural roads this month.

This is a Shire initiative to reduce the high level of injuries and fatalities from road crashes, In fact, road safety research indicates that by lowering speed limits and getting drivers to travel only slightly slower, the road safety benefits are significant.

The SaferSpeeds project will be trialled and independently assessed initially, with community views sought before and after the speed limit changes.

The changes are planned for late March and will be completed in April 2012. If you wish to find out more about the project there will be an opportunity to talk to Councillors and Shire officers at the Red Hill Market this Saturday, April 7, 2012 - look out for the Shire's van.

As you may be aware, Zimbabwe has long suffered from political and economic upheaval. Unemployment and poverty are widespread, and an HIV/AIDS epidemic continues to leave a trail of fragmented families in its wake. One in six children in Zimbabwe has been orphaned as a result of the HIV/AIDS epidemic. HIV/AIDS particularly affects communities living in poverty, where opportunities are already restricted. When one parent becomes ill and dies, a family loses its livelihood. When both parents die, children are left to fend for themselves or to

live with relatives struggling to feed their own family. A child's responsibilities become those of an adult and many children cannot attend school. Women and men are gathering together to participate in livelihood generating activities. From beekeeping to sewing to community gardens. these initiatives will create sustainable incomes for families living in poverty as well as provide the funds needed to send orphaned children to school. 


St John's Uniting Church Elsternwick celebrates 125 years of being church in October 2012
