# Charting a course through the social media maze


US guru Bruce Reyes-Chow plans to share his worship insights with all members of the PPEP faith community

HIGH Street UC, Frankston has the 'absolute pleasure' of hosting Bruce Reyes-Chow and his wife Robin during a working holiday this July.

Rev Dr Robert Johnson first met Bruce in San Francisco a few years ago when he was beginning to set up a new contemporary style church in an old warehouse.

Rev Jay Robinson says: "I was very keen to meet Bruce on my trip to Princeton last year, but unfortunately he was a late withdrawal from the course I was taking.

"So we decided that it would be good to bring Bruce out to speak, not only to High Street, but to the whole church on aspects around the use of social media and ask him: 'How can we do that well? Why is it good for the



generation Chinese/Filipino, who lives in San Francisco. An ordained Presbyterian minister, he was the founding pastor of Mission Bay Community Church. In 2008, he was elected the Moderator of the 218th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church, USA. He now earns his keep as a writer, speaker and consultant/coach with the Center for Progressive Renewal.

In his writing, speaking and living, Bruce is committed to expressing a Christian faith that is beautifully complex, unimaginably just and excruciatingly gracious. He also believes society and the church are strengthened by talking about issues like: denominationalism and the future church; faith and technology; race and politics, parenting, urban living... Bruce is a blogger and has a large social networking presence. He believes blogging is a spiritual practice and that technology is essential to a young church. Bruce will be sharing worship with High Street and the Melbourne Korean Church plus running a series of workshops and training sessions on social media. He will be spending time with the Cross Cultural Unit on their 2nd Gen camp, running a course at the CTM, and speaking with University Chaplains. He will be the special guest speaker at Revival, July 7, 2013 at High Street UC - 7pm.

# Laptop plea that will change lives...

Imagine a Uni student in Australia who does not have a computer? It has become a basic necessity not just for adults or students but even for kids.

I know there are unique elderly citizens who have chosen not to be too adventurous even to try to touch one in Australia. But they too are becoming a rarity and many are giving it a go.

The reality in Sri Lanka is that there are many University students who just can't afford one but have to use them for their study, research, assignments etc. Through some of my friends in Australia I am helping a Female student (old student of Jaffna College) from a very poor background, who gained admission to the Colombo University. While talking to her she told me that she does not have a computer and had to depend on using aher

friend's laptop whose brother is in the USA. I asked her how much she uses the computer for her studies. She told me that her lecturers assign work and tell them to look up in the internet. But she just can't afford one. I am writing to ask if anyone has a laptop at home just lying there collecting dust and not used or you know of anyone who may have one. I am happy to collect it and take with me when I visit Colombo late next month and give it to the Uni student who will be so delighted to get even a dusty old laptop. Some one's rubbish can be another's treasure

If you are able to help I would be most grateful.



# Reflections on Faith

#### HOW can we help those who do not have faith?

Ultimately, faith is God's grace working in us to understand and believe things far beyond our natural abilities. We cannot simply argue someone into believing, unless God works in their heart. Still, God can work through us to present the truths of the faith to others and remove confusion or misunderstandings about them. We should try our best to present the truths of the faith clearly to others, but even more we should lift up those who do not believe in our prayers, asking God to give them the grace of faith. The relationship between faith and understanding reminds us that faith is neither blind nor ignorant. Through faith, the mind is wed to God. Although faith is shrouded in darkness, God gives us real understanding in faith. The gift of understanding is a gift of the Holy Spirit and helps us to know the Truth more deeply than our eyes can see. God gives us this ability to 'see within.' He allows us to have an intuitive understanding.



Yuróra is a Dharug word meaning passionate. Yuróra seeks to mobilise young people to experience Jesus, to act in faith, to shake the church and beyond.

#### Where/When?

It will take place in an NCYC precinct in Masons Drive North Parramatta NSW from 7th until the 10th January 2014.

NCYC 2014 is open to all young people aged 16-25 with adult volunteers (26+) assisting at the event. It will be a festival-style event based at North Parramatta in Sydney. Port Phillip East Presbytery is currently organizing a bus tour to get to NCYC 2014 and back, so that we can be part of this amazing event.

Costs are being finalised but the plan is to leave Melbourne on Monday 6th January around 4pm and head straight up to Parramatta. We will then leave on Friday 10th January and head down the coast to come back home through Gippsland to arrive either the Monday or Tuesday 13th or 14th January. Registration costs are \$250, plus accommodation, and we are planning to stay in church halls whilst up there and on the way back, so those costs will be as low as we can make them.

## Diary dates for 2014

THE Season of Teaching and Learning in 2014 is going ahead and the Doctrine working group is preparing four new studies plus some study resource recommendations.

An intensive at Uniting College in the week following with the Dranes will also be possible.

The Doctrine working group is organising 'back to back' conferences on the *Basis* of *Union* and Preaching in Sydney on 22-24 August and 25-28 August, 2014.

There will also be the President's Ministers' Conferences in Charleville (June), Sydney (July) and Jerusalem (September). Ministry agents can be encouraged to attend one or two conferences making use of their provision for study leave
